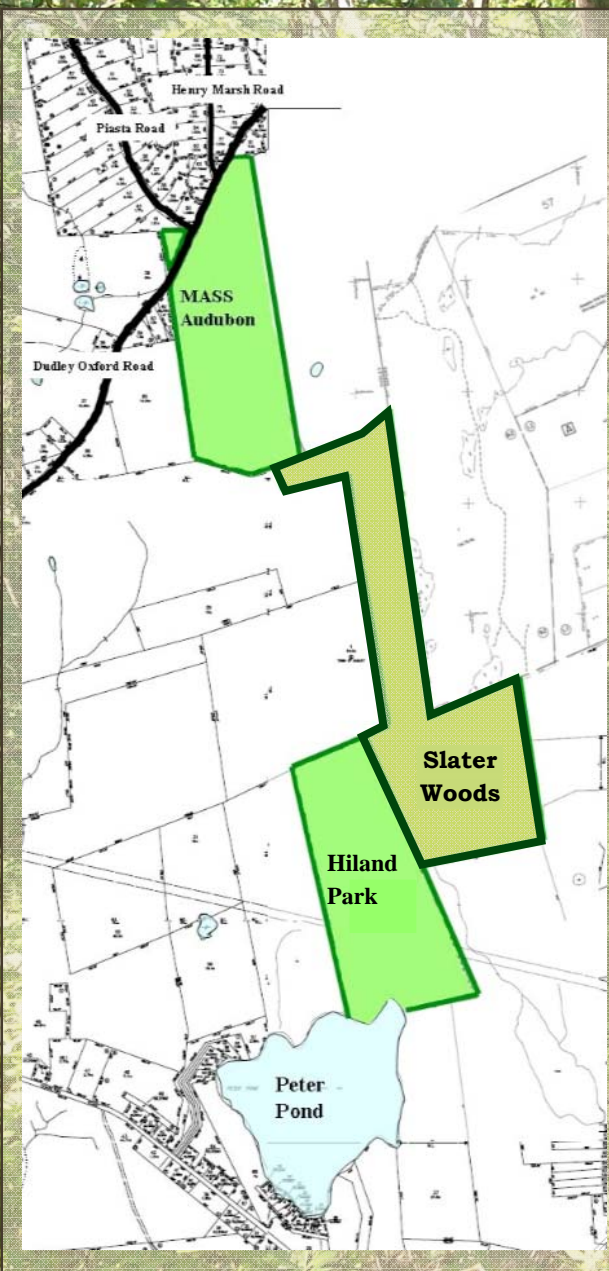


**A Partnership of the Dudley

Society and Mass Wildlife**

Slater Woods and Environs are 1,000+ acres of pristine woodlands, high rock outcroppings and verdant wetlands, located within the towns of Dudley and Oxford.

Presently almost 200 acres of this landscape is protected via a partnership with the DCLT, Mass Audubon and Mass Wildlife. An adjacent 55 acres is owned by the Town of Dudley. These lands extend from Mass Audubon holdings (across from Henry Marsh Road) down to Hiland Park in eastern Dudley.

The trailhead for Slater Woods is located on Dudley Oxford Road, and follows a cart path to the Olde County Road (a discontinued town road). From there, a trail continues through Slater Woods and Hiland Park to Peter Pond. Terrain can be best described as level on the cart path and Olde County Road, and rolling thereafter. All trails are marked with blue and yellow diamonds. Blue leads away from the trailhead. Yellow indicates that you are returning to the trailhead.



Please note that Slater Woods is a physically large area, with the journey from the trailhead to Peter Pond & back being about 5 miles. As such, allow sufficient time for your hike. In addition, please stay on the trails and respect the private property of the abutting landowners.

Hunting is permitted on Slater Woods and Hiland Park. No Hunting on Sunday. Hunting is not permitted on the Mass Audubon lands. For safety, wear blaze orange.
